

The University of Oxford is a collegiate research university with 38 separate colleges. There is evidence of teaching as early as 1096, making it the oldest university in the English-speaking world and the world's second-oldest university in continuous operation. The architecture of its colleges in the city's medieval centre led poet Matthew Arnold to nickname it the 'City of Dreaming Spires'. Virtually everything you might wish to visit is within walking distance.

After the restrictions brought about by the pandemic it will be a huge pleasure to welcome back our overseas friends. Not least of whom is Norbert Simon, Bailli Délégué of Austria and a member of both the Conseils d'Administration and Magistral, as our Inducting Officer.

The programme starts with a Dîner Amical on Thursday in the Old Bank Hotel. Then two fabulous trips for Friday and Saturday to Blenheim Palace and Shakespeare's Stratford.

The guided walking tours have the same content on both Friday and Saturday to give the widest opportunity for you to catch one.

Our Welcome Dinner will be held in the heart of the city in St John's College. Entering through a small door from St Giles is like travelling to a medieval world of Quads and gardens. The Gala Dinner will take place in the magnificent Dining Hall of Keble College

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PROGRAMME HIGHLIGHTS



Thursday 29 September Dîner Amical – The Old Bank

Oxford has a lot of history to offer and our first event will be held appropriately at The Old Bank whose site (92 – 94 High Street) dates back to the 13th century. We begin with drinks in the Italian garden terrace followed by dinner in the Red Room and the Gallery – both rooms having warm interiors and a striking art collection. Head Chef, Rohan Kashid, and his team are known for producing European Classic dishes with emphasis on British produce. This will be a fun evening to catch up with old friends.

Friday 30 September Blenheim Palace

A masterpiece of Baroque architecture, Blenheim Palace provides an awe-inspiring experience for visitors. Home to the 12th Duke of Marlborough and his family and the birthplace of Sir Winston Churchill, Blenheim Palace is a UNESCO World Heritage Site boasting a long and diverse history.

Blenheim Palace was built as a gift to John Churchill, 1st Duke of Marlborough, from Queen Anne and a grateful nation, in thanks for his victory at the Battle of Blenheim

on 13 August 1704. Today, the Palace is home to one of the most important and extensive collections in Europe, which includes portraits, furniture, sculpture and tapestries.

Our visit will include a self-guided tour of Palace and Churchill Exhibition, lunch in the Marlborough Room followed by an illustrated talk 'Churchill at Blenheim'. Time then to visit gardens and grounds. Then a brief stop at Bladon Church to see Churchill's grave together with those of other family members.





Guided Walk of Oxford City Centre

A great opportunity for those who wish to know more of this historical city as highly experienced guides will lead you around the key buildings and sights of the city. As well as covering the University highlights, there will be an opportunity to go into Oxford's most famous College with the oldest Chapel, Hall and Cloisters and where 'Harry Potter' was filmed. Included in the tour will be the Radcliffe Camera and Bodleian Library.

Welcome Dinner at St John's College

The beautiful and diverse buildings of St John's span the centuries from 1555 to the present. Named after St John the Baptist, patron saint of tailors, this Oxford College is best known for its Canterbury Quadrangle, a masterpiece of 17th century classical architecture.

Weather permitting, our Reception will be held in the gardens, followed by a candlelight dinner in the elegant 16th century Hall decorated with the College silver.

SATURDAY, 1 OCTOBER

Stratford-upon-Avon



The Saturday trip to Stratford upon Avon includes private guided tours of the Royal Shakespeare Theatre and key Shakespeare places in the town. In the theatre you will hear all about the workings of the theatre with engaging stories of its unique history. The experienced guides will lead you on a journey through the building's public and behind-the-scenes areas, sharing the magic of the Royal Shakespeare Company. This will include parts of the building that are not otherwise accessible to the public – the Costume Workshop – the largest in-house costume-making department of any British theatre – and the tower, whose viewing platform stands 32m above street level giving a superb view over the town's local historic buildings.

The guided town tour will include key buildings associated with Shakespeare, such as his birthplace, school, New Place where he lived, etc., led by a Blue Badge guide. The river trip on the *Jennifer May* canal barge includes a commentary of the passing sights and going through a traditional lock.

To cater for different interests, half the group will take the short river trip on the River Avon followed by the walking tour. The second group will take the walking tour then the theatre tour.

Lunch will be in the Theatre's Rooftop Restaurant. Afterwards there is time to make a quick visit to Holy Trinity Church where Shakespeare is buried. On the return journey the bus will stop by Anne Hathaway's Cottage before heading back to Oxford.



INDUCTION CEREMONY

This most important of ceremonies in the life of the Chaîne will be held at the The University Church of St Mary the Virgin. The Church dates from medieval times. It stands in the centre of the old walled city and is the centre from which the University of Oxford grew. The oldest part of the church is the tower, begun in the 1270s. The decorated spire is one of Oxford's best-known landmarks and claimed by some church historians to be one of the most beautiful in England. It is also renowned for its Baroque porch. Up until the 17th century graduation and degree ceremonies took place here.

We are grateful to the Rev'd Dr William Lamb for agreeing to let us hold our ceremony here. Additionally, we are delighted that he will give us a welcome and historical background to the church on the day.

The ceremony will conclude with a drinks reception in the Church.

GALA DINNER KEBLE COLLEGE



First Oxford College of the modern era, Keble was founded in 1870 in memory of John Keble, well known for his best-selling Christian verse. The chosen architect was William Butterfield and, although controversial choice at the time of polychrome brick, it is today considered one of the finest examples of Victorian Gothic anywhere.

The Gothic Dining Hall where our dinner will take place is the largest Dining Hall in Oxford and will provide a magnificent setting for our Gala Dinner.

Be aware that there are steps leading up to the Hall but a lift is available if needed.



OLD BANK HOTEL

Centrally located, this 5 star hotel was ranked 4th in Conde Nast Traveller top hotels in Britain. The Sunday Times says 'it is the place to stay in Oxford'. It is a breath-taking statement in design with many luxury bedrooms giving unrivalled views of the city's most famous landmarks.

Purchased in the 16th century by Christchurch College, the building was at first a drapers. During the Industrial Revolution, by the year 1808, this gave way to banking. The business was taken over by Barclays Bank in 1900. The building is Grade II listed and in 1998 was purchased and converted into a hotel by Jeremy Mogford. It is full of artwork collected by him over the years. At its heart is the Quod Restaurant, which is one of Oxford's most lively eating places. A hotel of timeless elegance which respects the history of the buildings, the hotel is now appreciated by people from all over the world.

OLD PARSONAGE HOTEL

Sister hotel to Old Bank, this old hotel was built on the site of the house of the Priest in Charge of a medieval hospice linked to St Giles Church next door. The present building was constructed for Edward Sellwood, the prosperous chef of St John's College, in 1660. It now combines the original charm and character with all the luxury, amenities and technology available to an independently owned 5 star hotel.

Please note there is no lift in this building but some rooms are on the ground floor.
